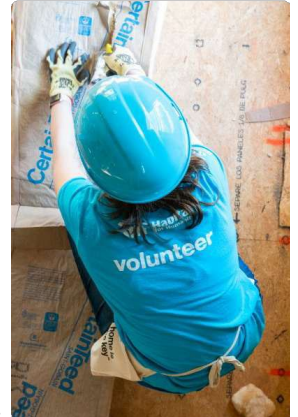


Scott/Bourbon Counties Habitat for Humanity Senior Home Repairs Application
